COLONY, HONEY PLANT AND MARKET CONDITIONS DURING JANURARY 2023

APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD, PA, VA, WV): January's weather was above normal for most of the month with only a couple of really cold days. Precipitation for the most part was in the form of rain with a couple of days where the District received actual snowfall, but it melted quickly. Beekeepers were able to check on colonies and add more food. A few even reported the bees broke cluster on the warmer days.

ALABAMA: In Alabama temperatures across the state were well above average for most of January, which contrasted far below average temperatures during the previous month of December. It is possible that the hard freezes during the end of December and early January, as well as the high amount of precipitation during the month of January, affected honeybee forage. Regardless, maple bloomed at the usual time in southern parts of the state. Camellias also started to bloom, as well as dandelion. Some beekeepers needed to feed. Spring build-up seemed to be on schedule, with colonies rapidly increasing in size during the second half of January. Capped brood nearly doubled, and even some drone brood was observed.

ARIZONA: No report issued

ARKANSAS: During the month of January temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation during January was well above normal for most of the same area. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Arkansas had normal soil moisture conditions across the state with a few areas of abnormally dry conditions scattered around the state. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

CALIFORNIA: Though January rains may have washed away some hives, overall forage should improve for California bees this spring, and tight supplies of colonies could mean higher rates for beekeepers who didn't commit early to contracts for almond pollination. Honey supplies remain tight for now.

"The January rains were generally a blessing for the bees, in that these rains should provide great forage this spring, and prospects for honey production in 2023 certainly look much brighter than the past three years," a beekeeper said. "That being said, there was localized flooding that impacted some hives, and of course some hives were moved from low lying areas before the rains to avoid the possibility of being flooded. I am not aware of any solid data on the number of hives that were damaged by flood waters in California this year."

"There is some mustard in bloom in the valley, most likely due to warmer temperature, which is good," another beekeeper said. "But most of the benefit from the rain will be from April on."

Almond pollination was set to begin in mid-February. Because acreage for orchards had been reduced recently due to lack of water supplies, some beekeepers, growers and brokers expected an oversupply of bee colonies for pollination and cut rates in advance. Then as winter colony losses exceeded estimates, some beekeepers couldn't fulfill contracts, which caused demand to rise unexpectedly.

"Growers and brokers are suddenly desperate for decent colonies to rent before bloom begins," a beekeeper said. "We'll see how this plays out." Another beekeeper said there didn't seem to be a serious shortage of California hives.

"Some out-of-state beekeepers did not send as many hives to California this year since many orchards on the west side of the San Joaquin Valley have been abandoned due to lack of irrigation water," he said.

With little honey left from 2022, markets remain strong. "Our honey markets are strong as ever, but our supply of honey is just about gone," a beekeeper said. New crop honey should become available in May.

"We are hopeful that the rains were very beneficial for us, but if the spring does not warm up, that benefit will be somewhat diminished," he said. Plus, although forage could increase due to rains, some hives were washed away during the storms.

Before the rains, some beekeepers moved hives into areas that veteran beekeepers had vacated because of concerns for potential flooding. "Their overcrowding the long-time established beekeepers did not pay off for them," a beekeeper said.

FLORIDA: Temperatures were about average with a few colder than normal days in northern Florida. Precipitation amounts were about normal during January, typically a fairly dry month in Florida. Bee health was considered to be below average primarily due to the lingering effects from Hurricane Ian. The freezing temperatures around Christmas and another shorter freezing event in January wiped out most sources of food for the bees. Maple did begin blooming in the middle of the month in the south and had moved up to Central Florida by later in the month. This was one of the few sources of nectar and pollen for bees. Supplemental feeding was required for almost all of the state during most of the month. Some bees were pollinating blueberries for part of the month and are expected to continue into February. Partly due to hive losses from Ian, Florida may only send about 50% as many bees to California for almond pollination this year. There also appears to be a surplus of almonds left over from last year's crop and more almond growers are beginning to use self-pollinating almond trees. With reduced demand for bees, pollination rates may be similar to last year's rates. Orange trees are expected to begin blooming around the middle to late February. Last year's production of orange blossom honey was very light. Producers are hoping for a larger yield this year, but citrus greening continues to remain a problem for Florida citrus growers and beekeepers. Some beekeepers will try to return home from California in time for orange honey production. No honey was produced during the month for commercial use and practically no honey was stored at the end of the month.

GEORGIA: Beekeepers are preparing the bees and hives for packages for sale later in the year. The bees in the hives look to be in good condition with weight. It has been cold, and the natural pollen flow was shut down temporarily during freezing temps the end of December. Beekeepers have supplemented with patties to keep the bees in top shape and bounce back from the earlier cold temperatures. Prices are higher and supplies are getting low. Sourwood and Tupelo \$6-6.50 lb in bulk barrels. Wildflower \$3.50 lb in bulk barrels.

IDAHO, COLORADO, UTAH: During the month of January temperatures were normal across Idaho. Utah and Colorado had warmer temperatures than normal. Precipitation for January was below average for Idaho and was way above average for Utah. Colorado had a little below average precipitation. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in January Idaho had very little relief from the dry situation. It had moderate drought to an area of severe drought along the southern border. Utah is currently under severe to extreme drought conditions with most of the state under severely dry soil conditions. Colorado has an area of normal soil moisture from the West side to the center of the state with areas of moderate to severe drought in the western portions of the state.

Most producers have their hives in California for the almond pollination and they will be there until around March, most other producers have their hives in storage for the winter.

Prices for the month of January were between \$2.80 and \$3.20 per pound with a mostly price of \$2.85-\$3.00 for Idaho, Colorado prices are too few producers reporting to determine a market. Prices for locally sourced honey in Utah are \$2.80-\$3.15 per pound with mostly \$3.00.

ILLINOIS: The weather for January has been mild overall with warm temperatures and more precipitation than normal. Beekeepers have been checking on the bees to see how they are doing. Beekeepers are also going to meetings, checking, and repairing equipment, ordering packages, preparing for the spring and participating in beekeeping classes. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

INDIANA: The weather for January has been very mild with slightly above average rain or snow. Temperatures were warm enough that bees took cleansing flights. Most beekeepers report their bees in good condition. Beekeepers are going to meetings and checking and repairing equipment. Demand for honey is good and demand exceeded supply at the retail level. Demand was fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

IOWA, KANSAS, MISSOURI, NEBRASKA: No report issued.

KENTUCKY: In Kentucky, the new year began with unseasonably warm weather that allowed beekeepers to apply an early-year varroa mite treatment to get the honey bees free of mites before the honey flow hits later this spring. The brief window of opportunity for beekeeping management ended with some of the coldest temperatures of the winter, including as if on cue, a minor ice storm. With the recent warm-up, beekeepers do not seem to have been affected as other industries in the state. Many are wanting to sell nucs (small "starter" beehives this spring) and posting pictures of their stock on Facebook.

LOUISIANA: During the month of January temperatures were well above normal for most of the state. Precipitation was well above normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Louisiana had normal soil moisture conditions across most of the state. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

MICHIGAN: No report issued.

MINNESOTA: During the month of January temperatures were a little above normal across the entire state. Precipitation for January was far above normal for the entire state.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in January the northern part of the state had normal to abnormally dry soil moisture. The central part of the state had abnormally dry soil conditions. The southern part of the state had moderate to an area of severe drought conditions.

Most producers have their hives in California for the almond pollination and they will be there until around March, most other producers have their hives in storage for the winter.

Prices per pound in Minnesota were \$2.80-\$3.75 with mostly price of \$2.80-\$3.00 for locally sourced honey for the month of January.

MISSISSIPPI: Most beekeepers are helping supplement the bees with sugar syrups and patties to keep them in condition. Plenty of wet areas and rain has kept them from being able to check in the hives. When they are able to see the bees, they appear to be in good condition and look good. Plenty of feed is on the way in Maple, Elm, Hackberry, Dandelion, Daffodil and many others depending on weather conditions coming up. Prices are up slightly. Light Amber \$2.78 lb and Dark Amber \$2.68 lb.

MONTANA: No report issued.

NEW ENGLAND: No report issued.

NEW YORK: Average to above average temperatures for January. Dry conditions continue in the northern finger lakes region, lower Hudson Valley, and Long Island. Beekeepers are feeding colonies. Reports of losses from virus/mites continue- some apiary yards were affected more than others. 25% of beekeepers statewide reported a Fall colony loss of at least 15%; in the Eastern and Northern regions, 37-40% of beekeepers reported a significant Fall/early winter loss. Local beekeeping classes are commencing. Slight post-holiday honey sales have slowdown but remain good.

NORTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

NORTH & SOUTH DAKOTA: No report issued.

OHIO: Northwest Ohio: Very cloudy with above normal temps in January. Several warm days for the bees to get out and take cleansing flights. With the heavy cloud cover the bees have remained in the hives and not flying. Today will be the 1st day all month that the temperature is not above 32 degrees. Honey prices remain stable, \$5.50-\$6.50 wholesale and \$9.00-\$11.00 retail.

West Central Ohio: Our temperatures have been above normal several days in January, some with clouds, yet many with the sun shining. Bees were able to take cleansing flights plus foragers were able to feed on Protein flour on the sunny days. Our rain falls this month was about 4 inches which helps with moisture in the soil. We also received 6 inches of snow. The beekeepers that harvested to much honey are busy feeding presently.

Wright-Patterson Air Force Base presently has 21 colonies of honeybees in three Bee yards. January rain fall at the Huffman Prairie Bee yard has received over 4.5 inches of rain.

OKLAHOMA: During the month of January temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was about normal. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, most of the state is currently under extreme drought conditions. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey

OREGON: No report issued.

SOUTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

TENNESSEE: Tennessee had a cold wet January. Nectar and pollen sources in January were Red Maple and Elm toward the end of the month. Beekeepers are still having issues with honey container availability. No large losses have been reported in overwintering colonies so far this year.

TEXAS: During the month of January temperatures were well above normal across the state. Precipitation during January was below normal across most of the state. The usual January ice storm waited until the last two days of the month to lock down most of North Texas. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, soil moisture conditions for January showed conditions starting to look more like an average January than the extremely dry conditions of the past couple of years. East Texas had mostly normal to areas of abnormally dry conditions. Central and West Texas had areas of normal soil moisture to moderate drought with an area of extreme drought to exceptional drought around the San Antonio area remaining from previous months. The panhandle area saw moderate drought to a few scattered areas of extreme drought. Far West Texas had normal to abnormally dry conditions. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

WASHINGTON: No report issued.

WISCONSIN: The weather has been good for January with very warm temperatures and little more than average rain or snow. Beekeepers are checking on the bees for winter. Some beekeepers are deciding to feed their bees with sugar. Most beekeepers report that their bees are in good condition, while others report some dead hives. Beekeepers are going to meetings, checking, and repairing their equipment and preparing for the spring. Demand for honey is good at the retail level. Fairly good demand at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.
